Overview:

Technologically proficient students are well prepared for academic success in high school and at the post-secondary level. Additionally, these skills help students transition successfully to the world of work. The goal of this course is for students to acquire an understanding of commonly used application software and develop an awareness of digital citizenship. In this course students will use several forms of word processing, spreadsheet, and presentation software. Students will work with digital cameras, photo editing software, and video editing software.

Grading:

- Late assignments are accepted. Students who turn work in late will receive a 50% deduction from their grade.
- Cheating and/or plagiarism will result in a zero and documentation on your permanent record with the possibility of behavioral consequences.
- When students are absent unexpectedly it is their responsibility to get their assignments before school on the day they return to school. They must also arrange to take any quizzes or tests that they missed while absent on the day they return to school
- Grades are earned, not assigned.
- Tests & Quizzes: Will be worth more points than daily work (Include, but are not limited to, multiple choice, essay, problem solving, matching, fill-in-the blank, short answer, etc)
- Daily Work: (Includes worksheets, homework assignments/projects, simulations, group work, current events, school store, etc)
- Participation: All students are expected to participate in all class activities every day.
